Eccovia Pilot Request

John Ward shared briefly about the transition plan to a new vendor for the Homeless Management Information System (HMIS).

- On November 16th, ICA presents its findings from the last two months of research, testing and demonstrations with two finalists
- Governing voted unanimously to remove WellSky as the current vendor
- Board elected to move forward with establishing Eccovia as the new vendor for HMIS

- The Institute for Community Alliances has asked the NWCoC to consider being a pilot CoC, to test the new system before going live
- Next steps:
 - Secure contract
 - o Plan
 - Data migration & testing
 - Build custom workflows & reports
 - Training
 - Launch: go live! (hopefully within the next 6-12 months)
 - Ongoing support & continuous improvement
- Questions & comments for John:
 - The option to participate in the testing and data migration phase represents an important opportunity to make system improvements for the NWCoC and statewide HMIS
 - o Will there be additional training for the NWCoC to pilot this project before going live?
 - This resource will be available to providers, and can help establish "HMIS Super Users" to provide training to their local agencies
 - Would each provider or agency be required to participate, or can agencies decide if they'd like to participate?
 - This will be a voluntary basis, and no agency is required to participate
 - Overall, the system has proved to be very user friendly, and will reduce system errors in HMIS
 - Will this change reporting capabilities, or will reporting still be under Business Objects?
 - Eccovia has its own reporting tool, Client Track, and Client Insight; main focus will be on client track
 - One thing that ICA is working on is establishing custom reports for each CoC
 - CoCs will still have access to WellSky data and reports, and can access information in WellSky across CoCs until the official launch takes place

YHSI Funding Opportunity

- The Office of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) has released a Notice of Funding Opportunity (NOFO) for \$50 Million, with a focus on improving systems for youth housing
- Grant terms are from June 1st, 2024 to December 1st, 2026 (30 months)

• Award Minimum: \$200,000

• Award Maximum: \$2,000,000

Application Deadline: February 15th, 2023

- Grant Eligibility: organizations can be local government, non-profit, and/or tribal government
- Priority is given to projects that can provide a 10% match

If the Northwest Minnesota Foundation determines that pursuing this grant is a priority, NWCoC Board approval will be needed in January. More information to come in the next weeks.

2024 Point-in-time count (PIT):

- The PIT Count is a nation-wide annual count of all persons experiencing homelessness, in both sheltered and unsheltered situations, this also includes individuals that are considered to be "doubled up" or "Couch hopping"
- January 24th, 2024 will be the official night of the Point-in-time- count

Who participates?





• Emergency Shelters, Transition Housing HMIS participants:

- For Emergency Shelter, Transitional Housing, and Safe Haven agencies that participate in HMIS, the night of the PIT is business as usual!
- The data you enter into HMIS about the people your program served on the night of the PIT will be included in the final PIT Count.

• Emergency Shelters, Transitional Housing non-HMIS participants:

- Data may be collected through a face-to-face survey or (rarely) aggregate numbers.
- Each CoC will communicate with the non-HMIS agencies in their region to connect them with the PIT process.

The unsheltered and doubled-up count is collected through face-to-face surveys of folks experiencing homelessness.

Next Steps:

- Make sure ICA is aware of changes to your programs, closures or new programs
 - o November-December: Notify ICA of any program changes
- Make sure your HMIS data is up to date
 - January: A spreadsheet will be sent out for you to review your projects, submit updates, etc.
- Participate! Even if you don't use HMIS, the HIC records all homeless-specific shelter and housing programs in a community.

o February: Review client counts in HMIS for accuracy

Board Onboarding Session

- In November, the NWCoC Board discussed an onboarding process for the new NWCC Board members in 2024
- This is in the interest of improving relations and creating more inclusive spaces for the Youth Action Board members
- This will also help new members understand expectations and requirements of NWCoC board members
- Should the NWCoC move forward with this process?
 - It's important to include information about what is within the scope of the NWCoC board
 - o Relying on past board members to serve as "board buddies" for newer board members
