About the NWCoC

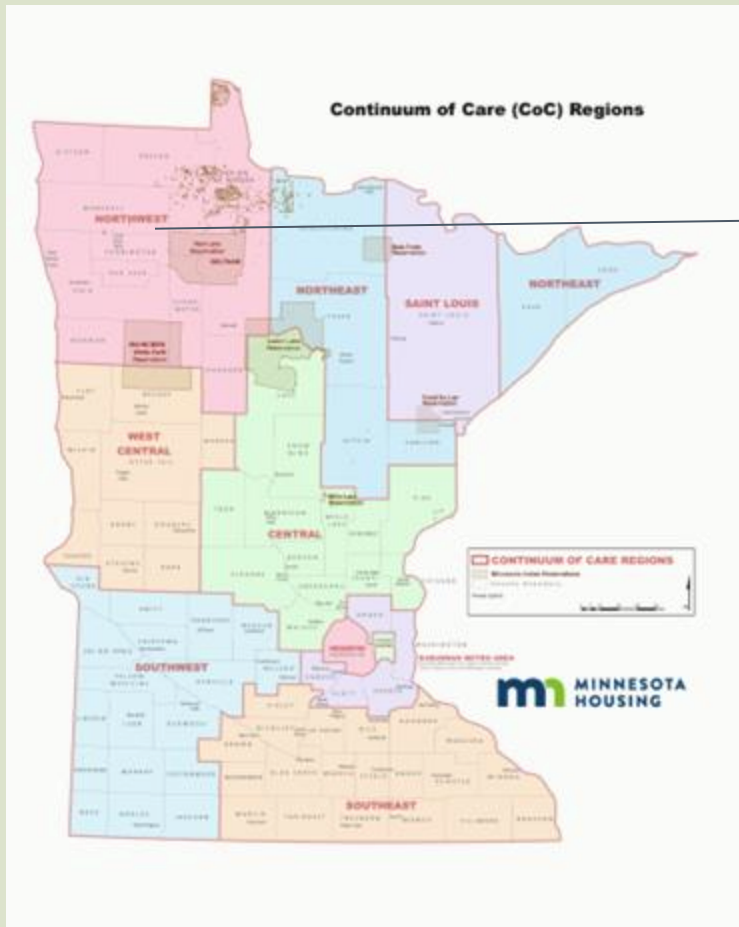
The Continuum of Care is a regional community planning body designed to promote a shared commitment to the goal of ending homelessness with a focus on:

Our Region

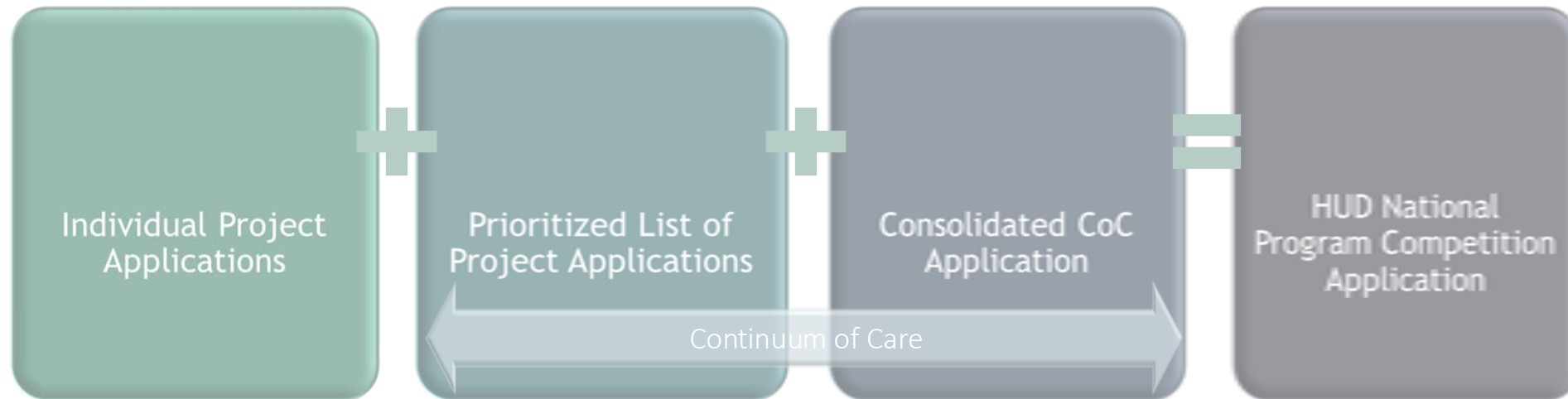




About the CoC Program Competition

- U.S. Department of Housing & Urban Development (HUD) releases a Notice of Funding Opportunity (NOFO) for CoC Homeless Program Funding.
- CoC Program Competition is often referred to as “THE NOFO”
- Nationwide funding competition among approximately 450 Continuums of Care.

NWCoC Local Competition Process



Threshold Criteria

Applicant will participate in HMIS or other comparable data base for DV providers

Eligible service population

Project application materials submitted by the deadline

Applicant successfully registered with SAM prior to application submission

Applicant does not have outstanding delinquent debt

Applicant is not debarred or suspended

Applicant agrees to adhere to a 25% match for all projects except for leasing

Threshold Criteria

Eligible entity - nonprofit organizations, states, local governments, instrumentalities of state and local governments, Indian Tribes and TDHE

Applicant project is located in the NWCoC geographic area

Applicant assures that CoC Program staff will complete Fair Housing training annually

Applicant agrees to follow CoC Housing First policy and NWCoC Guidelines and Written Standards

Application Requirements

Required Renewal Elements (housing projects)

- Renewal Project Application
- SAM Registration Status
- ELOCCS Report
- Narrative or policy for serving LGBTQ+
- Domestic Violence Service plan
- Housing First Assessment

Required New (or newly funded) Elements

- New Project Application
- SAM Registration Status
- Narrative or policy for serving LGBTQ+
- Domestic Violence Service plan
- Housing First Assessment

Required HMIS or CES Elements

- New or Renewal Project Application
- SAM Registration
- ELOCCS Report (renewal only)

ESNAPS applications will be due after HUD releases the NOFO and must be submitted to the CoC on time to be included in the final project listing.

Project Application Review Process

- Applicants submit all application materials to CoC by the deadline
- CoC Ranking & Review Committee reviews and scores applications using the CoC approved tools and policies
- CoC Ranking & Review Committee recommends draft project ranking and scoring
 - Draft Project Ranking & Scoring posted to CoC website for public review and comment
 - All applicants are notified of proposed rank and score and are provided the opportunity to appeal

Project Application Review Process

- CoC Board votes to approve Project Ranking & Scoring
- CoC Coordinator reviews ESNAPS project application and sends recommended changes
- Projects submit final ESNAPS application
- CoC Coordinator submits final Project List and Collaborative Application in ESNAPS
- HUD reviews applications at a national level

Reallocation

Reallocation refers to the process by which a CoC shifts funds in whole or in part from existing CoC-funded projects that are eligible for renewal to create one or more new projects.

CoCs can reallocate funding from any project eligible for renewal in a competition year.

Have returned 10% or more of funds from their previous 3 grant periods.

Competitive reallocation-The CoC can reallocate some or all of a renewal project's funding if the project:

Are deemed to be low performing by scoring poorly and/or having unsatisfactory project performance.

Does not meet all threshold criteria to apply.
