Why?

- Open, transparent, accessible
- Can't capture everything on paper
- Connect, listen, provide clarity
- Build trust, strengthen relationships, useful for YOU



Building Better Lives Grants

This is a new initiative of NMF that is reflective of our new strategic framework and 10-year horizon.

- Typical Award Period 1 year
- Average Grant Amount \$5,000 up to \$15,000
- Current Available Funding \$65,000
- Application cycle Applications accepted 3 times per fiscal year
 - November, March, and July



Eligibility

Eligible applicants include 501(c)(3) nonprofits, tribal organizations, and public entities serving any of the 12 counties and/or either of the Tribal reservations within our northwest region.

Fiscal hosts considered with a signed agreement.

For-profits are not eligible.

Application Process + Key Dates

- Must submit application online via the NMF Web Portal
- Opens 8am on Monday November 3rd
- Closes 11:59pm on Monday December 1st
- Decisions announced by December 31st
- Funds disbursed in January 2026



Evaluation Criteria

Applications are scored based on six key areas:

- o Purpose Statement
- o Community Context
- Activities & Partnerships
- o Participation & Access
- o Outcomes & Impact
- Budget Narrative

Purpose Statement (5 points)

Criteria for Review:

- The purpose statement is clear and concise.
- · The request is directly connected to the proposed project or program.

Community Context (15 points)

Criteria for Review:

- The applicant explains why the project is needed.
- The description shows an understanding of local conditions, needs, and service gaps.
- Information is provided on how the need was identified (e.g., data, feedback, assessment).

Activities + Partnerships (25 points)

Criteria for Review:

- Partnerships are clearly identified and documented (e.g., MOUs, agreements).
- Collaboration roles and responsibilities are defined.
